Find this story in your bibles in Luke 24. 13 - 35

Sunday 26th April 2020

### Start with a discussion:

What does it mean to have something revealed? Can you think of a time where this has happened to you? It can sometimes be a surprise and a shock all at once!

### The story

Two men were walking along a road to a village called Emmaus. Jesus walked up to them and asked them what they were talking about. They started to explain, but they didn't know it was Jesus! Jesus walked with the men until they got to the village and they invited him in for something to eat.

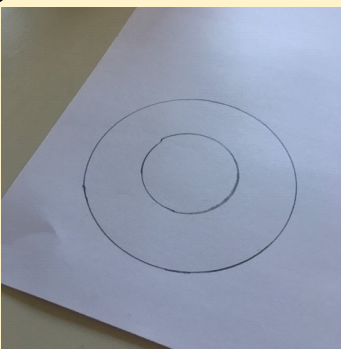

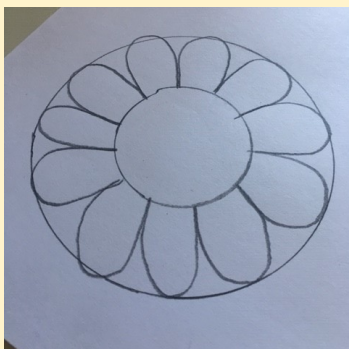
## Activity: Fabulous Folding Flowers!

### You will need:

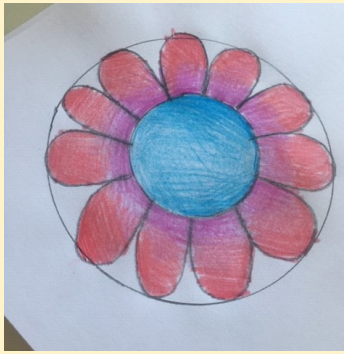
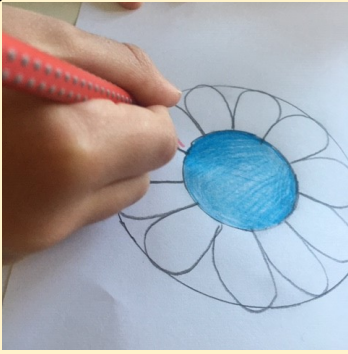
- White paper
- Scissors
- A drawing pencil
- Coloured pencils



Draw two circles (one inside the other) on a piece of white printer paper.

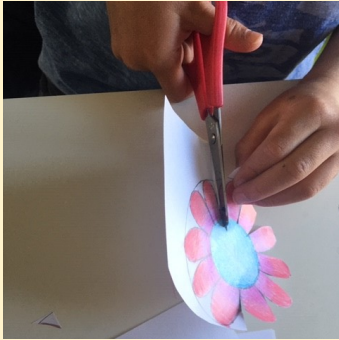


Draw petal shapes all the way around the centre circle, making sure you don't go over the lines.

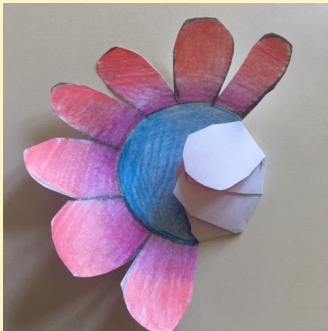


Colour in the centre of the flower and all the petals. Make sure your colouring is solid with no paper shining through. You can write a message in the

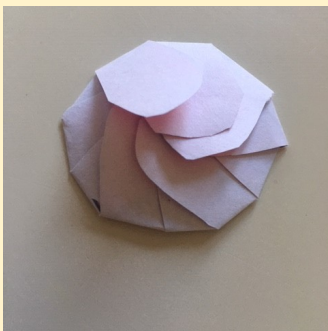
centre if you would like to send this to someone.



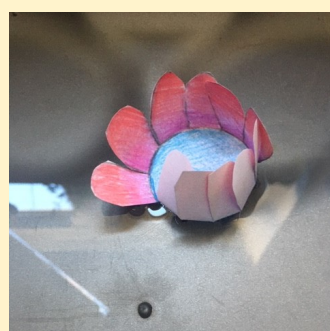
Cut out your flower shape. Make sure all your petals are cut to the inner line at the base of each petal.



Fold each of the petals in to the centre in order so they fold on top of their neighbouring petal.



Your flower is ready!



Pop into a bowl of water or dish making sure it is petal side up and watch the petals unfold to reveal the centre.
